

**BACHELOR OF ARTS IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE & CRIMINOLOGY (CJUS)**

**Declared Majors Prior to Fall 2017**

To complete the major, students must have (30) hours in criminal justice (including the CORE courses (CJUS 1100, 3100, and 3101) plus one course from the law enforcement, corrections, and legal areas (9 hours), and (12) hours of criminal justice electives); (3) hours in statistics (1220, 1221 or 1222); and (3) hours in a Foreign Language intermediate conversation level. An overall 2.0 in major courses is needed to graduate. Students must also complete a minor or second major and earn a total of total of 120 hours to graduate.

**NOTES:** CJUS 1100 is a **pre-requisite** for all required and elective coursework EXCEPT for: CJUS 1200; STAT 1220, 1221, 1222; and FORL requirement.
