

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE (CJUS)

Effective Fall 2025

To complete the CJUS major, students must complete 40 hours of Criminal Justice coursework. This includes 19 hours of required coursework: CJUS 1511, 1200, 2340, and 2370, – as well as STAT 1222 or 1221 or 1220 – plus one course in CJUS Crime Analytics, and one Engagement Across Perspectives course. Also, 21 hours of CJUS electives are required. To graduate, a student must have an overall GPA of at least 2.0, as well as in the major, and complete 120 credit hours.

REQUIRED CORE COURSEWORK:

Criminal Justice students must take and pass ALL these core courses to the right with a “C” or better. Students may attempt CJUS 1511 and 2340 no more than two (2) times, including all withdrawals and grade replacements of D or F. Students will not be allowed to continue in the major if they are not successful in two attempts. 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** Once students have at least 60 earned hours, they may take 3000/4000 level CJUS courses.
